



Tree of the Month -Salix matsudana 'Tortuosa' - Willow



This willow tree with its contorted branches can be seen on Martlesham Green nearest Birch Woods and was planted by Martlesham Heath Householders Limited (MHHL) in the autumn of 2022. The roots spread seeking and sucking up water an help reduce the moisture in this waterlogged area often impassible in the winter and early spring.

Salix matsudana 'Tortuosa' has a sinister past. Often found near watercourses and edges of village greens in the times of the 'Witchfinder General' any woman who was found to be a 'witch' could be seen hanging from these trees. Also, in English folklore, this willow tree was believed to be capable of uprooting itself and stalking travellers! Thank you to Lisa Calver for bringing this fascinating tree to our attention.

District Councillor Report EXCITING TIMES

In early August I went to Martlesham Playing Fields to see how the Changing Room for footballers was progressing. On my way I bumped into Mike Irwin, Parish Councillor and Chair of the Committee that meets regularly with Taylor Wimpey about progress at the Brightwell Lakes Housing Development.

Then I passed by the Church Runway Cafe and noticed that it was full of customers. It was the regular meeting of the Ladies Knitting Group and they filled up the room with friendship and chat, I was really impressed.

Finally I was able to see the Changing Room (see photo 1), which will include a shower and upgraded toilet area. Ed Thompson and I both contributed money from our Community Fund to help Fund the project, which will now be ready for the beginning of the football season.

I had noticed that there was building work going on at nearby Birchwood Primary School. There I met the always busy Paul Firman, who was supervising the building of the new 'Zen Den', which is now almost complete (see photo 2). The building is designed as a quiet room which will help students meet with a teacher in peace and quiet to talk through any issues that have caused problems. The Den will I'm sure be used for all sorts of other matters where a quiet room is needed. I was able to get the project under way from my Community Fund money.

Lastly, I recently organised a meeting with an officer from East Suffolk Services (ESS). ESS took over grass cutting, street cleaning, etc from NORSE over a year ago. There had been complaints about the overgrown state of Martlesham's verges and pavements. Also in attendance were David and Lisa from Martlesham Heath Householders and Jane Hall from the Parish Council. As

always there are reasons for the delay in grass cutting, which include schedules drawn up 20 years ago, changing weather patterns, too much rain and converting paper plans onto computers. The Officer is excellent and hard working and is getting it sorted, she was prepared to come and see us to talk over problems. Another bit of progress is that the officer has managed to get the redundant Street Cleaning Trucks into working order and residents may have seen them cleaning the local roads, this will be a regular event from now on.

Overall it was really encouraging to see building works under way, the knitting group thriving and locals and east Suffolk Council working together to improve things.

Dry spells this summer

As this summer progressed, we had some very dry periods with little or no rain, something likely to continue, becoming more prevalent with the changing climate. If this continues into September do not forget to keep an eye on summer flowering annuals and tender plants that may need watering to keep their display going into early autumn and even beyond! Regular watering will do wonders for crops such as tomatoes and runner beans so that you have some to harvest at this end of the season. Also check on any perennials, shrubs and trees planted this year which may need a good water every so often if dry weather continues. Keeping flower displays going can also help pollinators and other invertebrates.

September is a good time to look at and assess your garden; which plants survived and thrived, and which did not? Much of Martlesham has sandy free draining soil, which does not often get waterlogged in winter, ideal for many drought tolerant plants. Drought tolerant plants often do well in containers as long as they are sat on pot feet or similar over winter to prevent soil getting too wet. If you are in a damper location planting onto slight mounds can help keep plants more well drained through wet seasons. Observations and considerations can inform your plant choice for the future e.g. when you consider what to plant during the autumn and winter to fill in gaps or create new borders, and help future proof your garden display for you, others that may see it, and the wildlife that lives there.

News from Martlesham Wilds

Martlesham Wilds is non stop! While everything is growing beautifully fast at the Wilds, behind the scenes we have had our Planning Permission validated and we are now awaiting approval. We hope to give the 'wilding' a helping hand by creating and restoring wetland scrapes for wading birds, and digging new wildlife ponds and invertebrate banks. We also plan to provide two new viewing platforms for people to watch the wildlife on the restored wetland without causing any disturbance.

We hope you will be as excited as we are about these next steps for bringing nature back at Martlesham Wilds. If you are, you can help make them a reality by sharing your support for our proposals with the planning team at East Suffolk Council.

Just email planning@eastsuffolk.gov.uk with the subject line 'DC/24/1952/FUL' (our planning application reference) and in your own words say why you support our proposals above – whether its your love of birds or beetles, spending time in nature, or wanting to leave wildlife in a better state for your children or grandchildren.

Survey work is also ongoing, and we plan to share this later in the year once it has all been compiled – do watch this space for further news!

We would also like to thank all those that came on our 'Wonderful thing about trees' walk on Tuesday 7th August – we have such a wonderful evening walk and were amazed at all the different trees and hedges, young and old, that we discovered!

Martlesham Conservation Group

My grateful thanks to all the volunteers who have worked hard at clearing bracken and cutting back vegetation from paths and other areas on the Heath SSSI. It was also great speak to people from near and far at the recent Village Fete about our local wildlife and the work of the Group .

This year has been a very challenging one for some wildlife with cool and wet conditions earlier. Most butterfly numbers seem low particularly for the larger more colourful species such as Peacocks and Small Tortoiseshell. Some of the grassland species may not have been quite so badly affected and Holly Blue numbers seemed OK in the spring, but generally a poor year. I feel fortunate to have see one of our less common species, a Grayling butterfly in the centre of the Birch Woods. As insect numbers seem low there will have been a consequent impact on species that rely on them as a food source.

However, in September it may still be possible to see some interesting wildlife depending on the weather including a number of late summer butterflies such as Red Admiral, Peacock, Small Tortoiseshell, Small Copper, Common Blue, Brown Argus, Large White, Small White, and Green Veined White, so there is still plenty to look out for but who can guess what the weather will have in store. It may also be possible to pick up sightings of some birds on their return migration journeys after they have spent the summer here or the new generation of young birds undertaking their first long distance flight. Please keep a ready supply of water in your garden and leave bushes with plenty of berries.

From September onwards the Group continues with our regular series of monthly work parties aimed at helping our local wildlife. Mostly we work on the Martlesham Heath Site of Special Scientific Interest but also on other local sites. Work parties usually take place on the first Sunday of the month and last about 2-3 hours. If you would like to help please get in touch, we provide all the tools required. Our next work party is planned for Sunday 1st September at 10am out on the heath SSSI. Please meet at the interpretive signboard between Heathfield and The Oaks. We will be aiming to clear away some of the invasive bracken and brambles from the heath to leave more space and light for heather and grassland to come through for the benefit of a wide range of wildlife including plants, insects, birds and reptiles.

Martlesham Climate Action Did You Know?

Nice to chat to some of you at Village Day. We had some questions on our stand to get you thinking about ways to reduce your personal contribution (carbon footprint) to exacerbating global warming. Here are Phil Bull's questions helping to de-bunk some myths on EV car ownership based on his real-world experiences.

How long to charge my EV car?

I drive 100 miles, then stop for coffee and comfort break. I plug the car into a rapid charger.

Will I finish my break before the car has recharged 100 miles? Answer:

Charging at Takes Finished break?

150kW: 10 mins No

100kW: 15 mins Maybe, if I'm quick

75kW: 20 mins Probably

Carbon Footprint: EV vs Internal Combustion Engine (ICE) Car

How many miles do I need to drive a new EV to break even on CO2 emissions?

11,000 miles or 18 months (UK grid energy mix electricity)

9,200 miles or 15 months (fully green electricity e.g. from 100% renewable tariff/PV panels)

The calculation includes embodied carbon in vehicle manufacture and fuel plus typical CO2 emissions from an ICE car. The time calculation is based on a typical 7500 miles annual mileage.

In other words, it will take less than 2 years to 'pay back' the amount of carbon associated with making a new EV and it will then be releasing very much less CO2 compared to an ICE car (from the carbon footprint associated with generating grid

electricity; mostly from gas fired power stations as part of the generation mix). There was also some discussion on the environmental and human impact of mining lithium for batteries. Be aware that the environmental and human impact of the fossil fuel industry is far worse!

Energy Efficiency: EV vs Internal Combustion Engine (ICE) Car

My EV travels 4 miles per kWh (kiloWatt hour) on average (this is a typical value for most EV's). How far does an ICE car travel per kWh? Answer:

An ICE car travels 0.9 miles per kWh therefore an EV is about four times as efficient (and cheaper to run especially if you charge at home overnight!). The calculation is based on a petrol car doing 50mpg and a petrol calorific value of 45.46 kWh/gal


